Funding Opportunities

Community Addictions Prevention and Mental Health Promotion Fund Program -Health and Community Services The Department of Health and Community Services is inviting applications for the annual Community Addictions Prevention and Mental Health Promotion Fund Program. The fund provides financial support to individuals, community groups, schools and non-profit organizations interested in increasing awareness and understanding of mental health and addictions in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Community Safety Fund - Funded by Women and Gender Equity Canada and delivered by Fierté Canada Pride, the **Community Safety Fund** is a direct result of member-informed advocacy for 2SLGBTQIA+ needs.
